I have been a Cosmetology Instructor for forty years and know how important it is to learn to deliver student information for both traditional and special population students. Students need instructors with structure and lesson delivery experience to lead the classroom. I know many product teachers that can demonstrate a skill but cannot deliver education that a student can grasp.

I have 25 years of teaching an instructor's program that not only teaches demonstration techniques but spends many hours conveying ideas for lesson delivery. Just because a hairdresser knows the trade it does not mean they can convey the information. Some hairdressers in the salon take many shortcuts and cannot teach basic education.

I am definitely against the idea of abolishing the Instructor License and will continue to support the professional process of a licensed teacher is important for licensee success.
